Subject Area Committees (SAC) Update Curriculum Work, and ALC Update

Whitnie Del Toro presented to the board the SAC and Academic Leadership Committee to the board

The Subject Area Committees aim to empower teacher leaders and deepen teacher content understanding. The role of SAC is to write curriculum, write assessments, advise ALC on resources and professional development, and talking points.

The Academic Leadership Council (ALC) is a representative group of stakeholders that advises and makes recommendations to the Board of Education on matters concerning curriculum and instruction through the approved decision-making processes. It comprises teachers (representing all instructional areas), district administrators, building administrators, board of education members, and parents. Their goal is to establish a curricular governance based on research.

- Develop a long-range plan
- Make curriculum decisions
- Choose Subject Area Committees (SAC)
- Seek input from teachers
- Validate curriculum and local assessments
- Select and purchase resources as needed to support the curriculum

- Long-Range Planning
- Research
- Mastery, grading, and reporting decisions
- Appoint and guide SACs

ALC and SAC will work together to ensure the district supports each other and collect all the feedback

Elementary SAC team updates by grade were also included. A follow-up presentation in the fall will consist of teachers and more in-depth information on SAC.
