Shared Agreements Reflection

At the July 18, 2013 meeting, the Board of Education finalized their "shared agreements" and agreed to begin each regular board meeting by reflecting on one agreement. The Board revised the shared agreements on November 6, 2014. The purpose of the shared agreement is to help maintain a positive environment in which to conduct board work. Board Member, Morgan Banasiak shared her statement: "About a year ago, I spoke about all the ways the district has worked to make decisions according to what was best for all students. I feel as though many great things have happened since then, and feel compelled to speak about this once again. In the past year, the Board and Administration have worked hard to address health, safety, and academic needs in the district. Air conditioning has been installed in the middle school, and a plan has been devised so that in the next two years, the entire district will have air conditioning. We've survived and continued to thrive after covid and have continued to address the lingering social and emotional needs that have come from the Covid issues. A sixth-grade retreat was set up to help the students acclimate to the middle school and make new friends.

Blue Point has been activated in all the schools to better address safety and to work more efficiently with the police department. More cameras have been added to help with the system as well. A relocation drill was implemented, so the community knows how to respond to active threats. A tip line was set up at the middle school to help with monitoring behaviors at the school, and Hazel Street has officially been made a one-way Street.

A Student Advisory Board was set up at the middle school, so the students have an opportunity to be heard and take part in their school decision process. The Board members of District 33 and District 94 had a joint meeting to discuss ways to work together and help the students achieve more. An activity bus was set up to help the grade school musicians come to the middle school for practice.

These are all wonderful additions that have been made to this District, and I know that the board and administration will continue to think outside of the box to improve the lives of ALL students in District 33."
