This year's Gary fifth graders GATE students did an outstanding job and placed tenth in the nation in their division in the WordMasters Challenge, a national vocabulary competition that involves around 125,000 students annually. Throughout the year, the students studied and learned seventy-five new words and then demonstrated their understanding of the words through a series of tests consisting entirely of analogies!
