The Superintendent News is to update the board and community on some of the many programs and activities occurring in the schools and the departments determined to help us accomplish the goals of the District Strategic Plan.

Discussion of New /Ongoing Business with Possible Action

- 2024-2025 Administration Compensation Karen Apostoli, Executive Director of Business and Operations, shared with the Board of Education the continue the use of the Administrator Matrix as a New Hire Matrix for future administrators with annual increases of CPI-U up to 5% for the 2024-2025 school year. This would mean an overall increase of 2.02% to the total Administrator compensation package for the next school year. The Board will review the information and vote at the February 15, 2024, board meeting.
- *Finance/Facilities* Karen Apostoli, Executive Director of Business and Operations, stated that the district has received \$251,635.00 for Title I since the last board meeting.
- *School Board Self Evaluation* The Board reviewed the suggested protocols and expectations updates. The board will vote at the February 15, 2024 board meeting.
- *Transportation Contract* The board received information to renew the contract with IL Central's proposal of a 7.1% increase for 2024-25 and a 4.25% increase for 2025-26 with the following conditions:
 - 1. Full implementation of penalties for missed/late routes as identified in the contract.
 - 2. Exercise the right of Termination as described in the contract should the performance quality not meet expectations for the school year 2024-25.

 Healthy West Chicago Donation - The board voted to approve the donation from Healthy West Chicago of \$5,000 yearly for the next three calendar years (2024-2026). This donation is to ensure that all residents have access to optimal health and wellness
